A local small business has gone from strength-to-strength now opening a new showroom

A thriving local business that started with three members only five years ago and is now constructing dozens of buildings a year has opened its first showroom in Thornleigh.

Granny Flat Solutions started out small and now has 25 employees and builds more than 200 granny flats each year.

Their opening was attended by Hornsby state Liberal
